

#### Did You Know? FM is Phasing Out Fixed Lanyards

Why no more fixed lanyards? Fixed length lanyards offer a limited range of movement and protection, while self-retracting lifelines (SRLs) provide much greater flexibility and safety. The key advantage of SRLs is their ability to stop falls significantly faster than fixed lanyards.

**For Example:** You are working on a mobile elevated working platform (MEWP or "lift") and it hits a bump or obstacle, causing you to stumble on the platform. With a fixed lanyard, you might be prevented from falling to the ground, but you could still be thrown from the basket and suffer serious injuries.

An SRL, however, keeps you within the MEWP basket during a fall. The retractable line automatically locks, minimizing the distance you fall and significantly reducing the risk of major injuries

As we wrap up May as Mental Health Awareness month, let's all keep doing our part to keep the conversation and awareness going!


#### Do:

#### What Do UVA Apprentices Learn?

- → Related technical instruction is classroom instruction, hands-on learning, textbook readings, and written exams that supplement an apprentice's on-thejob training to further hone their knowledge and skills. Classes, books, and technology that are a necessary part of the apprenticeship education are paid for by UVA Facilities Management. Classes are held at FM during business hours and are taught by FM subject matter experts.
- → On-the-job training is hands-on experience gained by working with experienced UVA FM professionals who teach and guide apprentices on how to maintain UVA facilities at the highest quality.
- → Apprentice Roundtables are facilitated by FM Occupational Training to assist apprentices in developing core competencies that will support them in doing their job well. Roundtables are also an opportunity to connect with other apprentices, discuss current happenings in the program, and stay connected with program leadership.




#### Interview & Hiring Update
